According to the Bank's website, the project is part of the CHRU's real estate restructuring plan aimed at concentrating medical and surgical care from the five existing sites on three sites: Bretonneau, Clocheville and Trousseau. More specifically, it concerns the construction on the Trousseau site of the New Trousseau Hospital (NHT) and the New Psychiatric Hospital (NHP).

The project will significantly increase the efficiency of the CHRU's organization, consolidate the positioning of the CHU as a support establishment within the Territorial Hospital Group (GHT Touraine Val de Loire) and improve performance in terms of quality and safety.

ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EIB

When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you. You can write to the Ombudsman in any of the languages of the European Union.
