The project integrates 15 investment operations in favor of colleges and other cultural and educational infrastructures: 2 constructions of colleges; 2 college reconstructions; 4 operations to modernize and strengthen the resilience of existing colleges, including renovation, reconstruction and / or new construction; 5 operations to renovate other existing cultural and educational infrastructure; Various arrangements for internal modernization, improving energy efficiency and / or strengthening resilience to the risks of climate change.

When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you.
