Project Description

According to the bank website, the project proposal includes the reconstruction of the existing Rudjer Boskovic Institute (RBI) facilities in Zagreb and Sibenik, at the Research Station Martinska including construction of new research facilities in Zagreb, the acquisition of equipment necessary for scientific research and a reorganisation of the institute in four operational platforms. The project aims to transform the RBI into a modern, national and regional research infrastructure hub, which will be able to attract and maintain talents from the region. The concentration and prioritisation of the existing research activities at the RBI into four conceptual units is expected to stimulate cross-disciplinary science. The project integrates investments that address infrastructural and organisational deficiencies of RBI, optimising available expertise and existing physical infrastructure to internal and external demand.

ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EIB

The EIB Complaints Mechanism is designed to facilitate and handle complaints against the EIB by individuals, organizations or corporations affected by EIB activities. When exercising the right to lodge a complaint against the EIB, any member of the public has access to a two-tier procedure, one internal - the Complaints Mechanism Office - and one external - the European Ombudsman. A complaint can be lodged via a written communication addressed to the Secretary General of the EIB, via email to the dedicated email address: complaints@eib.org, by completing the online complaint form available at the following address: <http://www.eib.org/complaints/form> via fax or delivered directly to the EIB Complaints Mechanism Division, any EIB local representation office or any EIB staff. When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you.
