Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the project concerns the construction of new buildings, reconstruction, extension and renovation of pre-primary and primary schools in Marseille.

The implementation of works is managed by two promoters, the Ville de Marseille and the Société Publique des Écoles Marseillaises (SPEM), in accordance with their respective responsibilities.

A total of over 129,000 square meters of school infrastructure will be constructed or renovated to increase the city's school capacity and improve access to primary education.

The aim is to deliver high-quality education and enhance the comfort of learning environments for both staff and students, thereby facilitating the adaptation of primary school facilities to meet changes in local demand.

The project will also improve the energy efficiency of school buildings and strengthen their resilience against climate change risks.

Société Publique des Écoles Marseillaises (SPEM) is a local public development company of national interest created in February 2022 by the State and the City of Marseille. Its main objective is to manage the renovation and construction of 188 schools as part of the Marseille Schools Plan.
