Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the project consists of co-financing investment schemes supported by the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD) in Extremadura within the Spanish Partnership Agreement 2014-2020, with implementation until Dec-2025.

The Project will finance the region's contribution to the RDP, which includes the modernisation of some 9 200 farm holdings, as well as a total agricultural area of 869000 ha benefitting from enhanced biodiversity, improved water management, better soil management and prevention of soil erosion. It also targets 365 000 ha of forest area subject to management contracts in support of biodiversity, more efficient water management and better soil management. The Project also includes investments in physical assets, as well as capacity building activities. Finally, 70% of the rural population is expected to benefit from enhanced local development and improved services and infrastructures.

ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EIB

When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you.
