Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the operation will co-finance investment schemes supported by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) and European Social Funds (ESF) in Extremadura.

The aim is to co-finance investments made by the regional government of Extremadura in the period 2021-2027 under two regional Operational Programmes (OPs):

- the OP for investment in growth and employment supported by ERDF;
- the OP for Social Inclusion and Employment supported by ESF+.

When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you.
