### Project Description

As stated by the EIB, the project consists of the design, construction, commissioning, ramp-up and operation of an innovative large-scale vertically integrated lithium-ion battery cell manufacturing facility with a capacity of 42 GWh, together with an upstream cathode active materials plant and a battery cell recycling facility. The production is intended for the supply of European automotive manufacturers for premium electric vehicle models currently under development. The Project is located at the Northvolt Ett site in Skellefteå in northern Sweden.

The objective of the Project is to make a substantial contribution to the development of a competitive EU-based battery industry. The Project can be considered a key enabler for the development of the European EV industry.

According to [news reports](#), the subsidiary of the company NorthVolt filed for bankruptcy in 2024 and project was halted. However in February 2026, Northvolt's assets were acquired by a US based battery company known as [Lyten](#). The Skelleftea battery site has now resumed operations (<https://secure.businesswire.com/news/home/20260226538293/en/Lyten-Completes-Acquisition-of-Northvolt-Sweden-and-Establishes-its-First-Lyten-Industrial-Hub-in-Sweden>)



### Early Warning System Project Analysis

The Northvolt Ett Expansion project in Skellefteå carries several documented environmental, social, and labour risks despite its role in battery production for the energy transition. The project overlaps with land used by the Majsjaur Sámi community for reindeer grazing, where construction-related noise, traffic, and light are expected to cause “avoidance effects” that disrupt seasonal livelihoods, even though no physical displacement is reported. The industrial processes involved—including battery cell production and recycling—pose environmental risks linked to hazardous chemicals and waste streams, with evidence of high production waste levels raising concerns about pollution and waste management (electrive.com). There are also serious labour and occupational health and safety risks, including worker deaths, multiple accidents, and investigations into unsafe working conditions at Northvolt facilities (sifted.eu). In addition, the project has faced economic instability, with layoffs affecting around 1,600 workers and parts of the expansion being suspended, creating uncertainty for workers and the local economy (electrive.com; sifted.eu). Together, these issues highlight how large-scale battery projects can generate significant Indigenous rights, environmental, and labour risks alongside their climate objectives.

### People Affected By This Project

The Mausjaur Sami village has grazing rights over the project area. Potential impacts relate to an area 100 m north of the site, which may be used for reindeer winter grazing mainly during February and March. Potential avoidance effects could arise during the construction phase from noise, traffic, and light pollution. The promoter has an agreement with the Mausjaur Sami village that includes compensation and benefit sharing measures, and consultation will be ongoing annually.

Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you.
