Project Description

According to the EIB, this is a major allocation under the BOGOTA SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORT FL (20170904) for the construction of Bogotá's first automated metro line. The project includes a 24 km long elevated metro with 16 stations, a depot, and the supply of 30 trains. Additionally, it encompasses electrical installations, control systems, telecommunications, ticketing, and fare collection systems.

The project also covers preliminary works, the restructuring of some existing Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) lines and associated stations, and the upgrading of public spaces, including the construction of bicycle lanes. the project is expected to increase the attractiveness of public transport in the city and promote a positive modal shift from private modes, alleviating as such negative externalities of road traffic. The project will also increase accessibility to the job market and other major urban functions through reliable, fast, safe and affordable transportation The project is expected to generate savings in user time, vehicle-operating costs and fuel consumption, road accident costs, local air/noise emissions as well as a reduction in greenhouse gas emissions.


When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you. You can write to the Ombudsman in any of the languages of the European Union.
