## Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the project concerns the construction, rehabilitation and equipping of 15 technical secondary schools (lycées techniques professionnels, LTPs) across various regions in Benin. The loan is expected to finance infrastructure and equipment for six of the 15 LTPs included in the project.

This initiative aims to modernise educational infrastructure, align training facilities with international standards, and improve the employability of young people. The project is part of a broader effort to strengthen the TVET ecosystem, enhance the quality of instruction, and foster entrepreneurship and job creation. It is supported by multiple international development partners, including the World Bank (WB), the West African Development Bank (BOAD), the African Development Bank (AfDB) and the OPEC Fund.

Each LTP will be designed to include functional blocks such as workshops, specialised classrooms, dormitories, infirmaries, kitchens, and staff housing. The renovation works involve partial or complete demolition and reconstruction, depending on the condition of existing structures and the planned specialisations. These interventions are intended to create modern, inclusive, and safe learning environments that respond to local labour market needs.

Key social risks relate to involuntary resettlement (physical and economic displacement), vulnerable groups (Fulani herdsman), health, safety and security (labour influx, gender and gender-based violence).

### ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EIB

The EIB Complaints Mechanism is designed to facilitate and handle complaints against the EIB by individuals, organizations or corporations affected by EIB activities. When exercising the right to lodge a complaint against the EIB, any member of the public has access to a two-tier procedure, one internal - the Complaints Mechanism Office - and one external - the European Ombudsman. When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you. You can write to the Ombudsman in any of the languages of the European Union.
