Project Description

As stated by the EIB, the project consists of an equity participation into a generalist growth capital fund targeting private enterprises active in Africa.

The aim is to provide equity and quasi-equity to high-growth African enterprises, mainly family-owned businesses, thus contributing to develop the private sector in Africa.

The operation supports a number of sustainable development goals including SDG 8- Decent work and economic growth, SDG 9- Industry, innovation and infrastructure, as well as SDG 5- Gender Equality.

The fund not only aims at generating financial return but also at creating impact, since a share of the fund manager's profit is linked to several impact objectives: healthcare benefits, share of women among professional staff, decarbonisation, management of risks and negative socio-environmental impacts.

ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EIB

The EIB Complaints Mechanism is designed to facilitate and handle complaints against the EIB by individuals, organizations or corporations affected by EIB activities. When exercising the right to lodge a complaint against the EIB, any member of the public has access to a two-tier procedure, one internal - the Complaints Mechanism Office - and one external - the European Ombudsman. When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you. You can write to the Ombudsman in any of the languages of the European Union.
