Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the operation consists in a guarantee covering a portfolio of loans to mid-caps operating across all EIB's eligible sectors in the country.

More specifically, the EIB guarantee (an unfunded risk participation scheme under a full delegation approach) will cover up to 50% of the losses with respect to each defaulted loan of a portfolio.

The aim is to enable the intermediary to provide more loans to the target beneficiaries.



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Investment Description

• European Investment Bank (EIB)

A guarantee covering a portfolio of loans to mid-caps operating across all EIB's eligible sectors in the country.

Financial Intermediary

Financial Intermediary: A commercial bank or financial institution that receives funds from a development bank. A financial intermediary then lends these funds to their clients (private actors) in the form of loans, bonds, guarantees and equity shares. Financial intermediaries include insurance, pension and equity funds. The direct financial relationship is between the development bank and the financial intermediary.

ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EIB

The EIB Complaints Mechanism is designed to facilitate and handle complaints against the EIB by individuals, organizations or corporations affected by EIB activities. When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you. You can write to the Ombudsman in any of the languages of the European Union.
