## **Project Description**

As stated by the EIB, the operation will finance a portfolio of 269 MW of onshore wind and solar photovoltaic (PV) plants.

The project concerns 3 greenfield onshore wind farms in France, the repowering of three existing onshore wind farms in Italy (2) and in Germany (1), as well as the repowering of 7 solar PV plants in southern Italy.

A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you.
