Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the project concerns the 2025-2029 investment programme into the production and distribution facilities of VITENS, Netherlands' largest water supply company. The programme consists mainly of renewal and upgrading of water treatment plants, reservoirs, pumping stations, and distribution networks aimed at providing an even more reliable and climate resilient drinking water supply.


The project will secure and continue to enhance the quality of life to up to 6 million residents in the provinces of Flevoland, Friesland, Gelderland, Utrecht and Overijssel, by improving the reliability and efficiency of the water supply service. The project will ensure continued compliance with the Water Framework Directive (2000/60/EC), the Drinking Water Directive (2020/2184) and national norms.



Early Warning System Project Analysis

Due to the nature of the works to be implemented it is anticipated that the negative environmental impacts will mainly be only associated with the period of construction and will be mainly localised and temporary and reversible such as (i) minor disturbance due to pipe replacement techniques and (ii) temporary increase of traffic around the construction sites. These negative impacts will be mitigated with appropriate measures such as working outside the general breeding season within nature protected areas.

The negative social impacts of the Project are only temporary such as the possible disruption of water services and traffic, and noise and temporary occupation of public and private space.

A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you.
