Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the European Investment Bank (EIB) has signed a €20 million loan with Overture Life SLU to invest in the automation of assisted reproductive processes and the use of AI to improve IVF (in-vitro fertilization) pregnancy outcomes and fertility preservation. The agreement was signed during the Women Leaders in Life Science conference organised by the European Investment Bank Group (EIB Group) as part of Bio-Europe taking place in Vienna Nov 4.

Overture Life's technology automates egg freezing and IVF procedures, increasing accessibility for women. Specifically, the DaVitri platform includes a tabletop device that automates the vitrification (egg freezing and thawing) preparation of human mature oocyte, enabling egg freezing beyond throughput-constrained fertility clinics. It is designed to integrate seamlessly with both existing and new embryology labs. It is expected to contribute to increasing IVF access in Europe, reducing user variability and improving ease-of-use for what is today a complex process.

ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EIB

The EIB Complaints Mechanism is designed to facilitate and handle complaints against the EIB by individuals, organizations or corporations affected by EIB activities. When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you. You can write to the Ombudsman in any of the languages of the European Union.
