### **Project Description**

As stated by the EIB, the project consists of a Multi Beneficiary Intermediated Loan (MBIL) to Mediobanca Group entities to support small and medium sized enterprises (SMEs) as well as mid-caps in Italy.

The transaction aims to enhance access to finance to SMEs and mid-caps, mainly supporting investments carried out by micro and individual enterprises (with a minimum 60% contribution) and female owned businesses (minimum 20% contribution). Furthermore, on a best-effort basis, a portion of the allocations will be directed towards EU Cohesion Policy regions in Italy.

#### **ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EIB**

The EIB Complaints Mechanism is designed to facilitate and handle complaints against the EIB by individuals, organizations or corporations affected by EIB activities. When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you. You can write to the Ombudsman in any of the languages of the European Union.
