Project Description

According to the EIB, the project consists of purchase by the EIB of Green Bond instruments issued by the promoter under its Green Finance Framework, the proceeds of which will finance new eligible projects across the issuer's service territory in Germany, compliant with the Bank's Climate Action and Environmental Sustainability (CAES) framework and eligibility criteria.

The aim is to finance the promoter's investments to develop a transmission network and facilitate the integration of new renewable energy sources. It also supports EU policies on energy and climate, by enhancing critical infrastructure for decarbonisation. The underlying projects will be in Germany.

The project is in line with the InvestEU objective of the development of the energy sector in accordance with the Energy Union priorities in particular through the development, smartening and modernisation of sustainable energy infrastructure.

The project helps fill the growing investment gap in European electricity grid infrastructure, which is needed to support the European Energy Transition, as identified, among others, in the EU Clean Industrial Deal, the EU Affordable Energy Action Plan, and the EU Grid Action Plan.

The green bonds will finance electricity transmission network investments in Germany.

ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EIB

The EIB Complaints Mechanism is designed to facilitate and handle complaints against the EIB by individuals, organizations or corporations affected by EIB activities. When exercising the right to lodge a complaint against the EIB, any member of the public has access to a two-tier procedure, one internal - the Complaints Mechanism Office - and one external - the European Ombudsman. When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you. You can write to the Ombudsman in any of the languages of the European Union.
