Project Description

According to the Bank's website, ABB II (Asia Business Builders Fund II) is the second private equity fund managed by ABB. It is a sector-agnostic fund focused on the lower midmarket segment, providing growth capital to companies in consumer, education, logistics and other sectors.

FMO has invested in ABB II to support entrepreneurship in Vietnam, stimulating the growth of local mid-sized companies and contributing to economic development and job creation.

ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF FMO

A complaint can be filed in writing, by email, post, or online. The complaint can be filed in English or any other language of the complainant. The Independent Complaints Mechanism is comprised of a three-member Independent Expert Panel and it can provide either problem-solving, compliance review or both, in either order.
