PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The objective of the project is to kick-start rural renewable energy market transformation in Afghanistan and create the conditions for upscaling and long-term sustainability, through a combination of:

- policy and regulatory design, facilitating public and private sector financing;
- capacity building and awareness raising of the public and private sectors and end-users;
- investment in the set-up of 3 greenfield solar minigrids, providing access to 49,000 beneficiaries of which 23,500 women, and creation of an "upscaling
 - platform" to facilitate additional solar mini-grid investments.
