Project Description

According to the bank's website, "the BRAVE project will strengthen community resilience across the Sengkarang and Kupang watersheds through a source-to-sea landscape approach that will make development planning participatory and climate-informed, help communities adopt climate-resilient agriculture and aquaculture practices, establish an integrated runoff management and flood preparedness system, and build an enabling environment so that climate-resilient integrated water resource management and resilient livelihoods can be sustained, replicated, and scaled. Building on lessons learned from an Adaptation Fund initiative, BRAVE will address the systemic barriers that prevent climate adaptation by strengthening climate knowledge and planning, improving incentives and access to finance, enhancing institutional coordination, and supporting inclusive community participation. The project is expected to benefit 136,360 people directly and 1.2 million indirectly and will also promote the inclusion of vulnerable groups in decision-making and support dedicated livelihood activities for women's groups."
