Specifically, it aims to: (i) improve the monitoring and response capacity of government agencies responsible for disaster risk prevention and management by providing satellite images using synthetic aperture radar (SAR) technology; and (ii) improve satellite information to support the performance of productive sectors that use the specific applications developed through the program
