Project Description

According to the IADB, the objective of this Technical Cooperation (TC) is to support the preparation and approval of the BA-U0003 project, which seeks to contribute to reducing the burden of chronic non-communicable diseases (NCDs) and mental health conditions in Barbados . In addition, this TC will assist the Government of Barbados in prioritizing and preparing the technical, financial, and pre-investment studies required for health infrastructure improvements that will enhance service delivery capacity and resilience. The TC will also contribute to the design of a Caribbean Regional Debt Swap Facility and a potential investment loan operation in the health sector, to be financed with the fiscal space and savings generated through the debt-swap mechanism.
