According to the Bank's website, the general objective of this technical cooperation (TC) is to determine the climate risks posed by increased variability in climate change related weather patterns and to support the planning and implementation of adaptation measures to improve the resilience of public infrastructure to climate change impacts. Specifically, the aim is to map the degree of severity of risks to critical transport and energy infrastructure posed by natural hazards, increased variability in weather patterns, and extreme climate events at to create a prioritized set of risk mitigation investments and costs for the Government of The Bahamas.
