According to the IADB, the general objective of this Technical Cooperation (TC) is to support the strengthening of the DFC's institutional framework, operational conditions, and coordination mechanisms required to enable the effective implementation of a GF for MSMEs in Belize. Therefore, the specific objectives of this TC are: (i) to strengthen DFC's internal capabilities for the governance, institutional management, and operational implementation of the GF, and (ii) to support the development of strategies and capacities for the external management of the GF, including engagement with FIs and the enabling conditions for its effective uptake.
