The specific objectives are: (i) to support efforts to strengthen cross-cutting public management system and the integration of information systems to support evidence-based decision-making, accountability, and better alignment between national priorities and resource allocation;(ii) to support the implementation of the National Digital Agenda 2025-2030 and its digital government initiatives through the development of inputs, technical frameworks and implementation roadmaps that promote interoperability, coordination, and the delivery of scalable digital solutions.
