## Project Description

The overall objective of the TC is to support the Ministry of Environment and Water (MMAyA) in the development, dissemination and implementation of two key strategies for the water sector in Bolivia: (i) the National Strategy for Wastewater Treatment Plants (ENTAR); and (ii) the the Rural Water and Sanitation Strategy (ENRAS), giving continuity to the support that the IDB has been carrying out since 2015 in the definition and complementary studies for both strategies, tha have been also financed by the Latin America Investment Facility (LAIF) and the Spanish Cooperation Fund for Water and Sanitation in Latin America and the Caribbean (FECASALC).
