## Project Description

The Project comprises the construction of the wind farm cluster "Lagoa do Barro" ("LdB" or the project Company), which consists of 8 wind farms totaling 195.0 MW of capacity in the state of Piauí, located in the Northeast of Brazil. Each wind farm is a separate Special Purposes Enterprise ("SPE") and the eight are consolidated into the Lagoa do Barro holding (LdB Holding), a sub-holding under the the sponsor Atlantic. The proposed transaction is expected to finance the LdB project at LdB Holding level (the "Borrower").
