This objective is expected to be achieved through the provision of long-term and low-cost financing for investments by Small Internet Service Providers - (aka Provedores de Pequeno Porte in Brazil), contributing to the expansion of credit to the digital connectivity sector, investments in broadband networks, and consequently internet access by the population of all regions of the country, enabling factor of the digital transformation of Brazilian society.
