The objective of InfraInvest is to support the Government of Brazil in the planning, design, and programming of sustainable infrastructure programs, and enable the financial tools, regulatory and policy frameworks required to scale them up. This technical cooperation will support the Ministry of Planning to accelerate implementation of its infrastructure development plans whilst ensuring alignment with its Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC/Paris Climate Accord) and SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals), thus capturing the benefits and maximizing opportunities of a robust and sustainable development for the country.
