Project Description

The main objective of the Technical Cooperation (TC) is to support the subnational governments of Brazil, including municipalities and states, in the implementation of actions and promoting sustainability, road safety and inclusion of the mobility of people and/or cargo through implementation of actions such as: (i) development of Safe Paths for Schools programs, with define actions for highway security with use of the star rating methodology (Star Rating for Schools - SR4S of iRAP); (ii) use of artificial intelligence tools in the analysis of pavements and management of road assets (Pavimenta2); and (iii) development and implementation of road safety KPIs with a focus on vulnerable users such as women, children, the elderly, people with disabilities and the LGBTI population.
