The TC will support aspects related to the implementation of the program to contribute to the reduction of the housing deficit that Chile faces from the financing of capacity building activities and the installation of technologies in the MINVU systems, development of land bank, design of models protected lease management, and generation of green and low-carbon intersectoral housing and social infrastructure with non-traditional construction systems.
