The objective of this project is to advance Mangrove conservation/restoration by: (i) creating and implementing Conservation Agreements with local communities and stakeholders in the Morrosquillo Gulf in order to support, strengthen and implement community forest management practices and develop sustainable economic alternatives to environmental degradation; (ii) integrating wetland environments and related biodiversity into urban development processes in Barranquilla, through a public-private governance alliance, training, and sustainable financial mechanisms; and, (iii) systematizing lessons learned in order to scale-up this initiative to other coastal cities in Colombia.
