According to the Bank's website, this project finances the design, construction, operation and maintenance of a multipurpose port facility located in the Gulf of Urabá, Antioquia, Colombia, under a 30-year concession contract. This will include (i) an offshore deck with 4 berths; (ii) a 5.9km viaduct and access road that connects the offshore deck with the inland terminal; and (iii) 32ha of inland terminal / logistic facilities.
