Project Description

The objective is to define the roadmap to be carried out by Cormagdalena over a 15-year period, in order for them to have the tools necessary for effective authority over the Magdalena River. This roadmap should be governed mainly by four lines of action: (i) reforestation; (ii) pollution; (iii) artificial flow restriction; and (iv) shore conservation. These lines of action are important to ensure the river's navigability, which navigability the Colombian Government is actively promoting. Additionally, it is necessary to have an information system that should allow for monitoring of the basin and facilitate decision-making, in order to decisively advance the objective of this technical cooperation.
