The specific objectives are: (i) propose differentiated housing schemes that respond to the needs of low-income people and in accordance with regional characteristics associated with climatic and cultural conditions, promoting gender equity and diversity, as well as the formation of new low-carbon, sustainable and resilient households; (ii) identify key aspects that allow the feasibility of developing differential housing projects with emphasis on municipalities in categories 4, 5 and 6 and in rural areas; and (iii) identify housing solutions that contribute to improve or expand housing according to the needs identified by region.
