The objective of the project is to reduce and maximize safely the amount of plastic packaging waste for hazardous substances, involving the formal and informal sector through its collection, treatment using green solvent technology (supercritical CO<sub>2</sub>) and recycling of post-industrial and post-consumer waste, achieving the valorization of the waste in a sustainable way and recycling of post-industrial and post-consumer waste, achieving the valorization of polyethylene resin.
