As specific objectives, the Program seeks to: (i) ensure adequate final disposal of SW in the areas targeted by the intervention; (ii) increase the recovery and classification of SW, promoting social inclusion for informal recyclers, gender equity, and the inclusion of diversity; and (iii) reduce the generation of GHG emissions in the management of SW.
