Project Description

According to the IADB, the general objective of this Technical Cooperation (TC) is to strengthen the emergency preparedness capacity of Decentralized Autonomous Governments (GADs) by improving financial risk management. The TC will also support the implementation of the operation "Global Credit Program for Financing Contingent Lines for the Resilience of Decentralized Autonomous Governments in the Face of Emergencies (EC-L1320)," executed by the Development Bank of Ecuador (BDE). The specific objectives are: (i) to provide technical support to the BDE in the implementation of the global credit program; and (ii) to strengthen the institutional capacity of GADs for emergency response.
