This TC aims to support and fund the efforts of digitization and the digital economy in Haiti by developing an AI ecosystem that will enable businesses to understand the scale of the technological challenges, train qualified digital professionals and enable private companies to leverage AI to improve their operational efficiency, competitiveness, empower government to initiate brainstorm around policies and legal framework to regulate these initiatives. It will serve as a pilot to foster conversations about Haiti's potential and needs to integrate the digital economy as well as access and awareness to/about technology in the AI era.
