Project Description

According to the IADB, the objective of the CT is to develop technical studies of alternatives and feasibility analyses of structural and non-structural interventions for the improvement of the comprehensive management of MSW in the short and medium term, identifying actions for its regionalized management, under principles of circular economy and climate mitigation, with emphasis on the closure of landfills and the definition of regional sanitary landfills with methane capture and Comprehensive Waste Treatment Centers (CTIR), and with a focus on the reduction of waste generation, behavior change, gender equity, socio-productive inclusion of vulnerable groups and the promotion of productive chains for the recovery and transformation of usable waste.
