### Project Description

The objective of the Technical Cooperation is to support the preparation of the operation Support for Investing in the Future: Program for Feeding Vulnerable Populations (NI-L1155) aimed at improving the nutritional status in vulnerable school populations and preventing acute malnutrition in Nicaragua. Resources from the TC will be used to finance technical assistance for the targeting, planning, management and evaluation of the Program. The CT will support the design and development of a diagnosis of the nutritional status and food and nutritional practices of the school-age population. Finally, the CT will contribute to the development of the evaluation framework to assess the impact of the Comprehensive School Nutrition Program (PINE) on the nutritional status of school children.
