#### **Project Description**

The objective of the program is to contribute to improving the performance of the logistics sector in Panama by modernizing infrastructure, equipment and controls at border crossings with Costa Rica. The program's goals include deepening logistics services, efficiency and connectivity of productive infrastructure through an increase in the competitiveness of the national logistics system and the increase in customs declarations processed in Paso Canoas. The specific objectives are: (i) to implement effective processes and control tools; (ii) providing border crossings with modern and adequate infrastructure and equipment; And (iii) improve the local urban conditions for the articulation of border crossings with the environment.
