## Project Description

IDB: The overall objective of this Technical Cooperation (TC) is to support the Government of Panama in the implementation of a process of policy reform (PN-L1145), which seeks sustainable development of the energy sector, through: strengthening institutional capacity and sustainable reorientation of subsidies in the sector; diversification of the energy matrix with emphasis on the development of the natural gas industry; institutional consolidation of the Energy Efficiency Program; and strengthening the regulatory and technical capability to provide and operate sustainably in isolated rural systems. The Program is consistent with the Bank's Strategy with Panama 2015-2019 (GN-2838), under the strategic objective of enhancing the logistics services, efficiency, and connectivity of the productive infrastructure
