## Project Description

The project's general objective is to increase students' graduation rates in basic education in schools that benefit from the extended school day program, by increasing students' retention rates, and bringing back to school those who already dropped out. The specific objectives include: (i) provide, adapt or remodel spaces to implement artistic and technological educational programs to offer a comprehensive education package within the school day; (ii) develop and implement pedagogical innovations to support the extension of the school day in official schools; and (iii) develop and implement a strategy to ensure that overaged students receive relevant attention.
