Project Description

IDB: The general objective of this TC is to strengthen the institutional capacity of at least 5 countries to promote and implement energy efficiency (EE) projects, with a focus on improving energy use from public sector assets, including public buildings which may also benefit under this TC from support to promote complementary distributed renewable energy generation (DREG) investments programs. This will include: (i) providing technical support to design EE programs; (ii) reviewing and strengthening existing EE programs and regulations; (iii) conducting technical assessments of EE and in the case of public buildings, complementary DREG potentials; and (iv) designing and implementing related EE and DREG investment programs targeting public buildings, street lighting and other public sector assets.

The Independent Consultation and Investigation Mechanism (MICI) is the independent complaint mechanism and fact-finding body for people who have been or are likely to be adversely affected by an Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) or Inter-American Investment Corporation (IIC)-funded project. If you submit a complaint to MICI, they may assist you in addressing the problems you raised through a dispute-resolution process with those implementing the project and/or through an investigation to assess whether the IDB or IIC is following its own policies for preventing or mitigating harm to people or the environment.
