Accodring to the bank, the objective of this TC is to support IDB member countries in their efforts to prevent money laundering and terrorist financing, by complying with the FATF Standards (The Financial Action Task Force is an independent intergovernmental body that develops and promotes policies to protect the global financial system against money laundering, terrorist financing and the financing of proliferation of weapons of mass destruction.). The TC will combine a demand-driven approach, with a careful assessment of countries' *Anti-Money Laundering* (Combating the Financing of Terrorism (AML/CFT) needs. In this sense, requests for support from specific countries will be considered along with the results of the Mutual Evaluation Reports (MERs) provided by the FATF, focusing on areas where there is a strategic need to improve the AML/CFT frameworks.
