According to the bank, the objective of the project consists in building a world-class prediction model that can assist stakeholders like law enforcement agencies or victim service providers in identifying the victims who are truly at greatest risk from among many victims who appear, a priori, to be at risk of domestic violence.

Building upon the experience of the Chicago Crime Lab (CCL), the research team would engage with 2-3 jurisdictions in Latin America (cities or central governments) in order to build a state-of-the-art risk tool to identify victims of domestic violence who are at greatest risk of experiencing repeat victimization.
