## Project Description

The objective of this TC is to strengthen the technical capacity of the Municipal Decentralized Autonomous Governments (GAD) of border cities in Ecuador such as Huaquillas and Tulcan and the Peruvian border city of Zarumilla (border with Ecuador), which presently shelter a large number of migrants; so that an adequate provision of water, sanitation and solid waste services are provided for all, both migrants and their host communities.
