According to the IADB, the objective is to provide support to LAC local governments to design innovative urban solutions through targeted knowledge and practical exchange, that will result in specific pilot projects to adapt and test the identified solutions. This objective is aligned with the iterative work of the Cities LAB to achieve a more sustainable, inclusive, and equitable urban development in the region. To this end, the TC will be structured in the following components: (i) exchange of international experiences; (ii) design temporary experiments; (iii) develop policy recommendations; and (iv) dissemination of knowledge. Given the current COVID-19 crisis, activities related to social distancing, citizen participation, reviving the local economy, use of public spaces, use of innovative technologies, and big data analysis, among others, will be prioritized.
