## Project Description

The objective of this TC is to strengthen the urban and health sector's knowledge around the existing relationships between a city's characteristics and competencies its density, environmental quality, mobility patterns, and management processes, among others and its citizens health. The TC will have 2 components. The first component will dig into the recent experience of selected cities in the COVID emergency and will reflect on actions taken and lessons learned to provide recommendations for future sanitary crisis. The second component will gather existing knowledge about urban environmental quality and its incidence on health, and will identify the factors that contribute to favorable or unfavorable results (air pollution, building materials, urban design, insecurity, density, connectivity, among others). Within this framework, It will then develop and test tools to promote healthy cities, to be tested in two or three pilot cities.
