The objective of this Technical Cooperation is to support the implementation of the IDB Group's Gender Perspective Employment Action Framework (MAEG). The MAEG proposes a strategy for mobilizing actions and accelerated investment in response to the COVID crisis to recover, create and transform employment in the region with a gender perspective, articulating the responses of the different areas of the IDB Group and recognizing the impacts differentiated from this crisis on female employment.
